

Fire is an ever-present concern for stable owners. Contact your local fire department to do a walkthrough of your property and provide recommendations for a pre-plan. A qualified electrician should also evaluate your facility. There are many steps that can be taken to establish good fire prevention practices. The following list provides an excellent starting point:

	Smoke detectors/alarms are present and tested (batteries changed) as per manufacturer's recommendations
	A floor and site plan is located on my property and includes instructions on how to shut off the utilities (everyone has knowledge of this)
	10 pound ABC fire extinguishers are mounted at each exit and everyone at the stable knows how to use one
	All electrical wire is encased in non-corrosive conduit, outlets are GFCI protected and extension cords are rated outdoor and for temporary use only
	All fans and heaters used are suitable for agriculture
	All light fixtures are encased in safety enclosures or LED lighting is used
	Regular cleanup and disposal of debris including cobwebs, hay and bedding
	Flammable liquids, fuels and combustion powered equipment are not stored in the stable
	Hay and bedding are stored in a separate building a practical distance from stable (note: few days supply of hay/bedding can be stored in stable)

The following list provides an excellent starting point:

— Outside —

Address/emergency (911) # is posted in reflective numbers and is visible from both directions on the road (note: should be posted inside stable as well)
Driveway/road can accommodate fire department's vehicles - there are no overhanging branches and roadway is gravel or other improved base
There is a plan for winter consideration (daily snow/ice removal) for my driveway/road
A pre-plan has been completed with the local fire department
All weeds, brush and debris have been cleared from around stable
"No Smoking" signs are posted around stable and boarders have been informed that smoking will not be tolerated anywhere on property
Owned and tenanted vehicles are parked in a designated area away from the stable
Clearly marked, easy-to-access, water spigots are located on all sides of my stable
Rubbish and debris is regularly disposed of from around the farm
Lightning rods are installed properly on farm buildings
