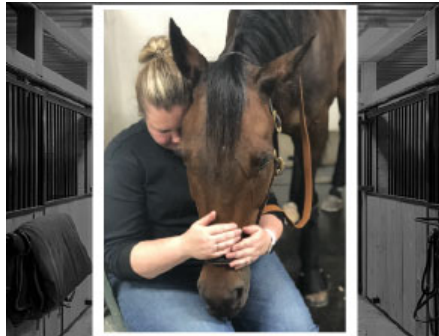

Guelph research looks at tools to help predict disease spread in horse populations

Two studies published in January 2019: In the first, researchers used non-invasive radio frequency identification (RFID) tags to collect data on which horses came into contact with one another on horse farms. The second study used data collected with the RFID tags to help create and compare contact networks at horse facilities in Ontario.
